

It is particularly fitting that the book should be published on September 21, the day which marked the eighty-first birthday of Mrs. Roosevelt. This volume will be of immense value to those interested in the family histories of two of our most prominent and aristocratic families. Mrs. Kleeman has been fortunate in having the close cooperation of both the Roosevelt and Delano families, and has had access to diaries, private papers and letters which heretofore have remained in obscurity.

Is Life of President, Too

For the first time an intimate glimpse of the President's childhood is revealed to the public. Reproductions of his school-boy compositions are included along with the personal reflections of Mrs. Roosevelt on his youthful years and up through his spectacular rise to the nation's highest post.

In the years to come those who seek to catch the quality of the period from a little before 1890 to our day will turn to his work as an important source. They will do so because of Williams' unrivaled memory for physical detail and because of the no less astonishing accuracy with which he portrayed the mind of the ordinary man of his period.

Fashions Recorded

"Those who want to know what sort of men and women lived in the American midlands from the time of Cleveland onward to our day will find many of their questions answered in his work. They will find there the record not only of changing fashions in dress and decoration but also of changing habits of thought and behavior. As men today turn to Hogarth to recapture aspects of the England of the eighteenth century, they may well turn to Williams to recapture our period. They may do so with great confidence, for Williams seldom preached and never scolded. He had no axe to grind. His affection for the people and manners of his boyhood did not lead him to exaggeration of their virtues or to a jealous contempt of the contemporary world."
