

J. B. Denman Not Participant in Automobile Crash

In a police report of an automobile accident on September 21, WILMETTE LIFE last week was informed and so stated that J. B. Denman, 1352 Elmwood avenue, while driving at Wilmette avenue and Main street had struck a car driven by Mrs. Mary Haggard, 2439 Birchwood lane, crowding it into the opposite traffic lane, thereby causing it to collide with a taxi cab belonging to the New Taxi company of Evanston.

Mr. Denman states that he did not strike any other car, did not crowd any car out of its line of traffic, and had nothing whatever to do with the accident. According to Mr. Denman's version of the incident, he made a right turn into Wilmette avenue from Main street. The gates of the Chicago and North Western railroad were down. There was one car in front of him and two others at the left, waiting for the gates to rise. When the barrier was raised he followed the car ahead of him, and the two cars at the left also proceeded. He states that he was as far to the right as he could go, and that another car was attempting to pass with insufficient room. He heard a slight noise as though two cars had come together, but felt no shock and kept on his way, not being involved.

Sergt. Joseph Steffens of the police department stated that he examined the Denman car but could find no evidence that it had been in an accident. This version of the affair is given in justice to Mr. Denman.
