## Equestrienne Aids Fall Fashion Show

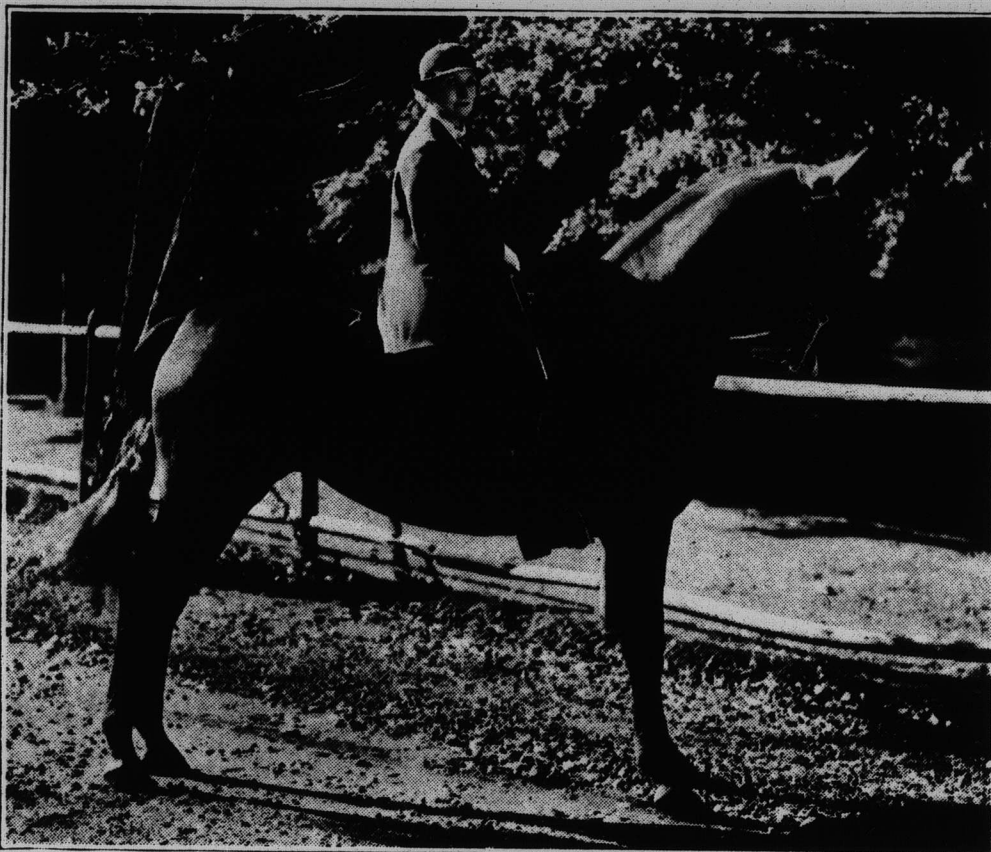
