TEATRO OFFERS REVIVAL WEEK

Schedules November 10-16 for Return
Showing of Seven Great Films
Chosen by Vote of Patrons

One of the most impressive chapters in north shore amusement history will be unfolded on the screen of the Teatro del Lago during Revival week November 10 to 16, devoted entirely to return showings of pictures chosen by vote of the patrons. The week will bulge with seven of the greatest films ever produced.

During the past month Teatro patrons have been voting on a huge blackboard in the lobby for what they consider the best pictures of the past. After a month of heated voting, seven out of approximately thirty pictures were chosen for showing during Revival week.

The winners and the order in which they will be shown are: "The Lives of a Bengal Lancer" Sunday, November 10; "All Quiet on the Western Front" Monday, November 11; "The Scarlet Pimpernel" Tuesday, November 12; "It Happened One Night" Wednesday, November 13; "The Thin Man" Thursday, November 14; "The Count of Monte Cristo" Friday, November 15; "The Gay Divorcee" Saturday, November 16.

"The Lives of a Bengal Lancer" features an excellent cast headed by Gary Cooper, Franchot Tone, Richard Cromwell and Sir Guy Standing. Brittle dialog, swift direction, pictorial magnificence and intelligent production put this on the "must see" list.

"All Quiet" Armistice Day

Armistice day brings "All Quiet on the Western Front," considered the greatest of all war pictures. It dares to show what war is really like—what war means. A great cast, including Lew Ayres and the late Louis Wolheim, live the roles in this powerful drama. "All Quiet on the Western Front" was awarded the Photoplay gold medal as the best picture of 1930.

"The Scarlet Pimpernel" features Leslie Howard at his best as a courageous young Englishman posing as a fop in order to rescue French noblemen from the guillotine. Merle Oberon, as his wife, is lovely in this swift, colorful adventure film.

Rated Best Movie of 1934

A gay, well directed drama—that's "It Happened One Night," winner of the Motion Picture Academy award as the best film of 1934. Clark Gable and Claudette Colbert strike up an acquaintance on a bus from Miami to New York . . . and then adventure gets under way.
