Committeeman Posts Citizen League Topic

At a meeting of the New Trier Citizens league, held last Friday at the LaSalle hotel, the recently created office of Township Committeeman came up for exhaustive discussion. The league, which is non-partisan, has for the past twenty years been the body through which candidates for exclusively township offices have been nominated.

The meeting attracted a large number of interested citizens, not all members of the league. Frederick O. Mason, 857 Ash street, Winnetka, president, was chairman. Following an explanation of the new office, created by a state statute which eliminates the precinct committeemen, and a statement as to its importance in the future political welfare of the township, the group proceeded to a discussion of whether the nomination of candidates for the new office, one on the democratic ticket and one on the republican ticket, properly comes within the scope of the league, as they are distinctively partisan political offices and in no sense non-partisan.

Expressions of opinion from those present revealed the consensus to be decidedly against any effort on the part of the league to participate in the choice of candidates. It was, however, the unanimous thought that the league might properly present to the democratic and republican party groups a statement as to the type of man or woman who should be nominated by them in order that the interests of the township, rather than partisan political organizations, might be served. Definite action was secured when a motion was made that a committee of seven be appointed to draft such an expression for submission to party leaders, and report back to a future meeting of the league.

Owing to the shortness of the time in which petitions of nomination must be filed, the committee met at Winnetka Community House Sunday evening. The results of its deliberations will be presented to the league at an early date.

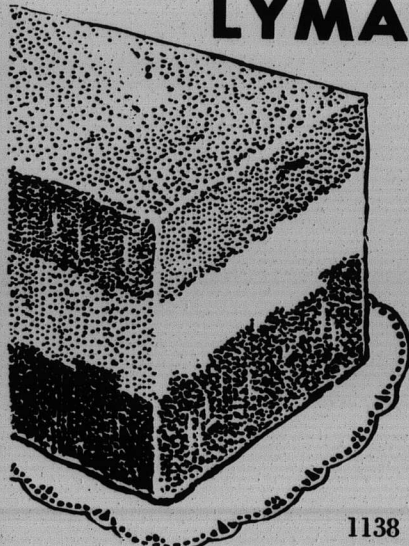
