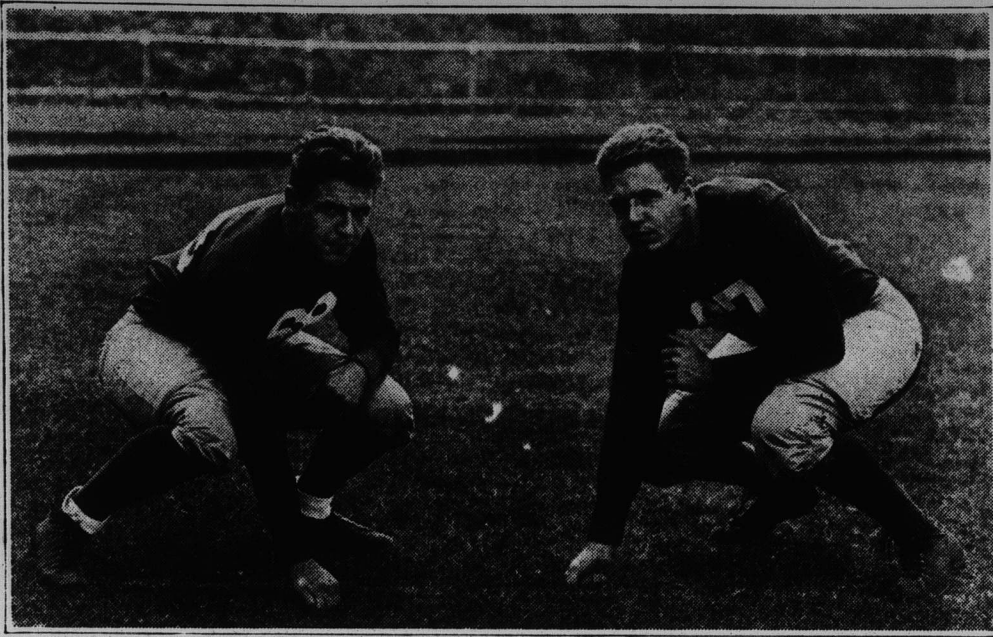


GET GRID LETTERS AT DENISON
