Sunday, December 22, will be the fourth Sunday in Advent. There will be Holy Communion at 8 a. m., Church school and Bible classes at 9:45, and a service of Confirmation at 4 p. m., which will replace the regular 11 a. m. service of worship.

On account of Bishop Stewart's visit to St. Augustine's Sunday, December 22, there will be no morning service at 11 a.m. This service has been transferred to 4 p.m. when Bishop Stewart will administer the sacred Rite of Confirmation. After he has addressed the candidates Bishop Stewart will address the congregation. This service will last about one hour.
