Lighten Their Climb Back to Health

Home Loans Continue on Unabated Advance

Credit outstanding at the Federal Home Loan Bank of Chicago made its fifth climb into an additional million dollar class for the past six months early this week when total loans to member building and loan associations were chalked up at the new peak of \$16,005,045. At the beginning of June the figure was \$11,652,595, and loans have climbed steadily since that time, increasing the use of the bank's credit in its Illinois-Wisconsin district by 37 per cent.

A. R. Gardner, President of the bank, far from seeing the present volume as the height of the bank's possibilities, expects the spring lending season for new homes and for buying of existing homes to usher in as great if not greater era of expansion of credit than has characterized the last six months. He pointed out that 25 per cent of all the credit extended by the regional bank to local lending agencies, since it began in December, 1932, has been disbursed since June 1 this year.

"It is as if the savings, building and loan associations had just begun to realize the benefits of the system to their communities and to themselves during the last half year," he said. "In some ways we have little reason to expect much of a slack in the upward trend of advances even during the winter months, since the greatest bulk of the home loans being made by the member building and loan associations today are still for refinancing the loans which other types of institutions cannot satisfactorily carry any longer. This process goes on winter or summer, according to the date of the mortgage's maturity, and will keep up a constant demand for funds of the associations in Illinois and Wisconsin until practically every mortgagor has shifted his home indebtedness to the long-term plan.
