

Crane Tech Next Basketball foe For New Trier's Varsity Quintet

Game Will Be Severe Test of Strength for N. S. Boys

New Trier High school's varsity and freshman-sophomore basketball teams will swing into action Friday night of next week after three weeks of inactivity so far as interscholastic competition is concerned. Crane Tech of Chicago will furnish the opposition, and the games will be played at Winnetka.

That New Trier's varsity team will have its hands full is indicated by the fact that Crane ran up a total of 80 points against its first two opponents, Waller and Calumet, in the annual University of Chicago Christmas holiday tournament. Waller was defeated, 41 to 16, and Calumet, 39 to 19.

High Scoring Forwards

The New Trier players will have to see what they can do about stopping Crane's two forwards, Harry Krotish and Quinto Valentino, who made 57 of their team's points against Waller and Calumet. Krotish accounted for 31 of these points, and was leading in individual scoring as the tournament quarter finals were reached. Valentino made 36 points.

New Trier has some sharp-shooters, too—such fellows as Bud Fisher, forward, and Carleton Wilson, guard—so the New Trier-Crane scrap should be a free scoring affair. Wilson, who was third high in individual scoring in the Suburban league last season, made thirteen points in New Trier's opening league game against Waukegan on December 6. Fisher made fourteen points when New Trier whipped Oak Park, 35 to 32, a week later.

Hope to Hit Stride

Since Proviso inflicted a double defeat on New Trier on December 20, holding Wilson scoreless and Fisher to four points in the varsity game, the home fans are anxious to see New Trier return to its winning stride. Both the varsity and freshman-sophomore teams were undefeated until Proviso came along and toppled New Trier from the league lead.

Test of Strength

While the outcome of the New Trier-Crane Tech games will have no bearing on the Suburban league standings, it will serve to indicate what may be expected of New Trier in the future. New Trier needs a warming up, for the first post-holiday league opponent will be Morton of Cicero, whose varsity and freshman-sophomore teams are undefeated and are holding first place in their respective divisions by virtue of Proviso's defeat of New Trier. The Morton-New Trier games are scheduled for Tuesday afternoon, January 14.

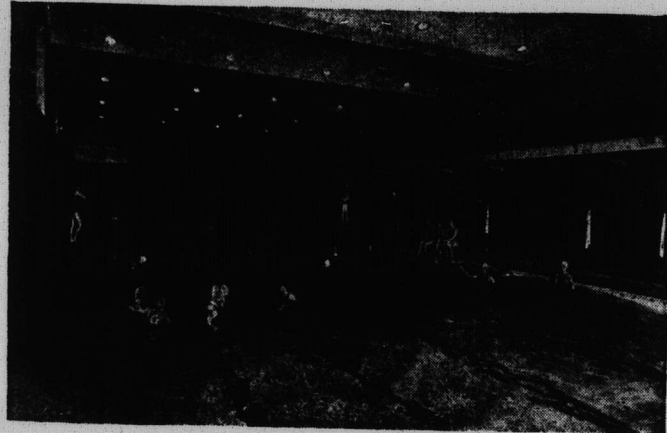
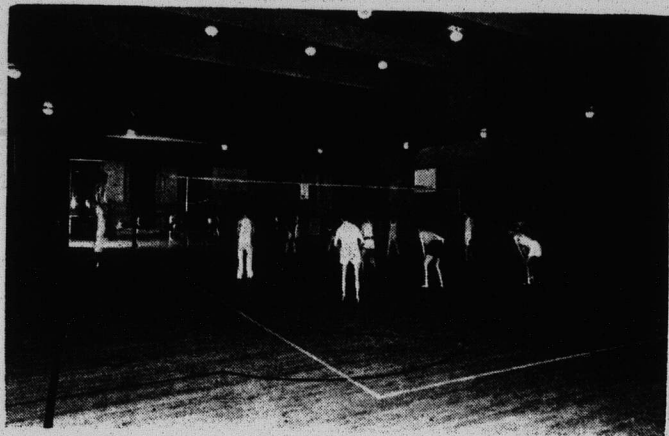
