books. Yes, he had, but they don't pay nearly so well as articles. Back in 1917 he wrote "Common Sense in Labor Management." Later on he did a biography, "An Inside Story of Success." He has been toying with the idea of writing a book on the art of interviewing. But one book brings him royalties ranging from \$1.36 to \$8 a year. Another netted \$400, and the best returns so far have been \$2,700 on a third work.

It was hard for me to depart from this fountain of wisdom, who was so amiably dispensing data on the tricks of the trade. He confessed that he loved the variety of his work, no month the same as another, no monotonous routine. We ended with an intimate discussion of the personalities of interviewers. We agreed that they should be significant-looking creatures whom anyone would at once recognize as being harmless, honest souls. The only exception to this rule, said Mr. Clark, was Samuel Crowther, who is huge and makes an immediate impression on everyone meeting him. Mr. Clark was firm about his own desire for the reverse of the publicity spotlight. After all an interviewer should stay in the shadow.
