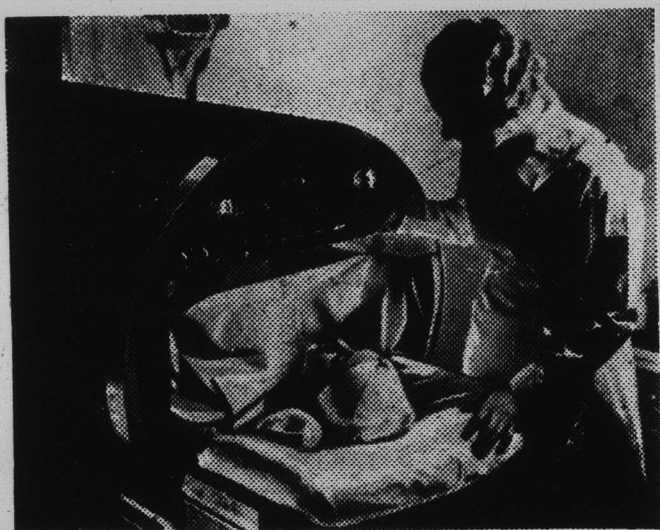

Two Famed Preachers at Sunday Evening Club

Two preachers of international reputation will speak at the Chicago Sunday Evening club in Orchestra hall on May 24, the last meeting but one of the present season. Dr. Albert W. Palmer, formerly of Honolulu, now president of the Chicago Theological Seminary, is to give the informal Bible talk at 7. He has just returned from the Pacific Coast where he spoke in leading churches and universities.

Dr. Lynn Harold Hough, dean, Drew university, Madison, N. J., summer time preacher in London's famous City Temple, is to address the main service, beginning at 8. Dr. Hough took a leading part in bringing about the union of the North and South branches of the Methodist Episcopal church at the convention held by that denomination in Columbus Ohio this past week. For years he was one of Detroit's leading clergymen as pastor of the Central Methodist church.

Jessup Will Give Address at N. U. Commencement Day

Walter A. Jessup, president of the Carnegie Foundation on Teaching, will deliver the commencement address at Northwestern university's graduation exercises at Dyche stadium June 13. The baccalaureate sermon will be given by the Rev. H. Clifford Northcott of Champaign, Ill. The services will be held June 12 at the First Methodist church of Evanston.

A memorial service for the late William A. Dyche, former business manager of the university, will be held at the commencement exercises. The Rev. Ernest Fremont Tittle of the First Methodist church of Evanston will deliver the memorial address.

A total of 1,437 degrees will be awarded by the university at this year's exercises. The commencement exercises will climax a week filled with a busy round of pre-graduation festivities.

The program will open with a series of clinics and alumni reunions by the professional schools of medicine, law and dentistry on the McKinlock campus. The annual Alumni Day for the entire university will be held Saturday, preceding the commencement exercises.
