## Dorothy Duncan to Wed Canadian Monday, June 22

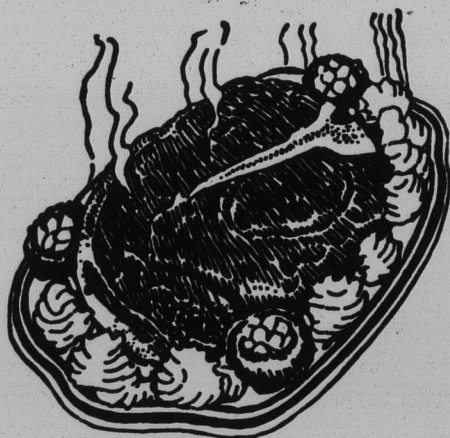
