"The Forerunner of the Faith was Mirza 'Ali Muhammad of Shiraz, Persia," reads an announcement, "who on May 23, 1844, proclaimed his two-fold mission, as an independent Manifestation. . . and the Herald of one greater than himself who would inaugurate a new and unprecedented era in the religious history of mankind."

The ninety-second anniversary of this historic event will be celebrated in Foundation hall on Saturday evening, May 23, by the Baha'is of Chicago and all the north shore assemblies.
