FAMED DUTCH **CONDUCTOR AT RAVINIA PARK**

William von Hoogstraten Will Be Guest Conductor of Symphony This Week-end

Returning from a holiday in Europe, Willem van Hoogstraten will go directly to Ravinia Park, where he will conduct the Chicago Symphony orchestra during the third week of summer concerts, beginning Thursday, July 16, and continuing Friday and Saturday evenings and Sunday afternoon.

A guest conductor in great demand, Mr. van Hoogstraten has been regular conductor of the Stadium concerts in New York City. Here his work has been largely responsible for the success of this experiment in symphonic music out-of-doors during the summer months.

He has appeared at the Hollywood Bowl and with the St. Louis, Detroit and San Francisco orchestras. After his Ravinia appearance he will go to Portland for a broadcast July 23.
