COMMODORE SMITH WINS SATURDAY'S RACE

In perhaps the lightest breeze of the season so far the Sheridan Shore fleet sailed the second race of the B Series on Saturday afternoon. Although Van Gathany in Pegasus crossed the finish line first he was disqualified for fouling one of the other Stars at the outer mark. The lightness of the wind permitted a course of only two legs, a beat to the three mile buoy and a run home. Commodore Smith in his new Star Katydid II led Silver Spray by over two minutes, Tom Waage in Skipit following half a minute later in third place. Twinkle Ditto was disqualified at the start for port-tacking Hummer II.
