"FURY" IS RATED AS SANITY PLEA

"Heart's Divided" Is Story of Napoleonic Era on Varsity Theatre's Screen

Rated as an outstanding appeal for sanity and as a sincere effort to avert mob madness, lynchings, and other forms of violence, "Fury," directed by Fritz Lang, and starring Spencer Tracy, Sylvia Sydney, Bruce Cabot, Edward Ellis, and Walter Abel, comes to the Varsity theater's screen this Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

"Fury," say the critics, furnishes a powerful delineation of the emotions of human beings, collectively and individually.
