

Report Heavy Enrollment Request at N. C. E. Demonstration School

**Augment Staff for New Term
Starting September 16**

The Children's Demonstration school at the National College of Education will begin one of the busiest years in its history on September 16, if the flood of inquiries from parents about registering their children for the school year is any indication.

Young students, ranging from nursery school age up to high school, will come from all parts of Chicago and the north shore to attend classes. Many of them will use the bus service offered by the college which brings the children from their homes to the school and back again under the supervision of student teachers.

Augment Teaching Staff

There will be four new members on the staff of the Children's Demonstration school. Miss Janet Learned of Philadelphia, who has her bachelor's degree from Wheaton college, Mass., and her master's degree from the University of Iowa where she specialized in the pre-school field under Dr. George D. Stoddard, will direct the Nursery school.

Miss Miriam Wigginton, a graduate of the University of Nebraska and Columbia university, who taught in the nursery school at Purdue university last year, will teach the four-year-old children at the Demonstration school.

Miss Maurine Bredeson, whose master's degree is from Columbia university and who has taught in the Milwaukee Public schools for several years, will be in charge of the first grade.

New Co-Director

The new co-director of the fifth and sixth grades will be James H. Griggs, who has his bachelor's degree from Harvard university and his master's degree from Columbia. He comes to the National College of Education from the schools of Des Moines, Iowa.

According to Miss Clara Belle Baker, director, the Children's Demonstration school will gradually add more and more men to the Demonstration school staff. Eventually the school will have men acting with women teachers as co-directors for the upper six grades of the elementary division because education experts and psychiatrists are discovering that "boy students respond more readily and eagerly to men teachers than to women and even show a revival of interest in formerly distasteful subjects if the 'male' viewpoint is stressed."

Appoint Librarian

The library of both the college and the children's school will be in charge of Clarence R. Graham, formerly a member of the staff of the Louisville Public library, Louisville, Ky., and a graduate of the University of Kentucky and Western Reserve university.

Miss Annette Sincox, a graduate of the Training school of the Evanston hospital and of the Normal school at Oshkosh, Wis., will hold the position of college nurse during the coming year.

Mrs. Thomas E. Roberts of Oak Park, as Associate in Guidance, will be in charge of the college dormitory. She is a graduate of the National College of Education and has a master's degree from Columbia university. Mrs. Roberts was at one time supervisor of the kindergarten and primary grades in Fort Wayne, Ind.

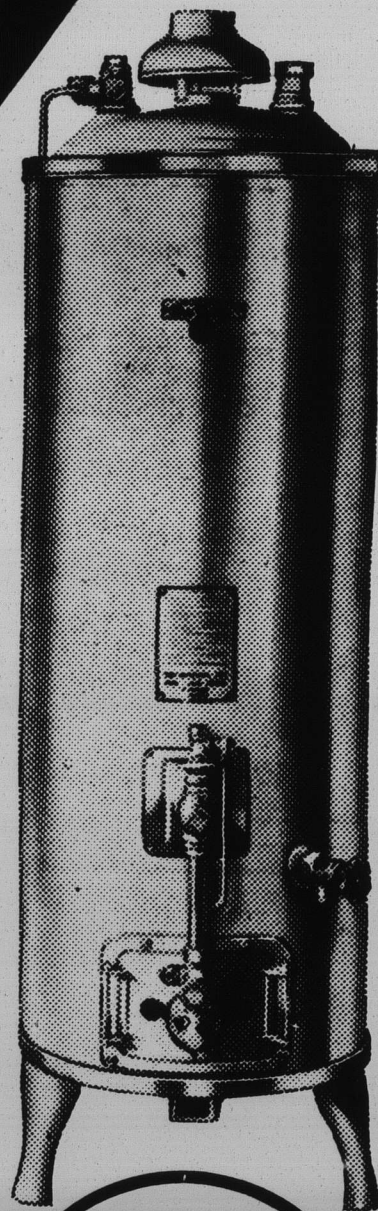
