

## Women Voters League Will Meet Next Week at a Buffet Luncheon

The Wilmette League of Women Voters will hold its first meeting of the season Wednesday, November 11, at 12:30 o'clock at the home of Mrs. G. T. Hellmuth on Church road in Winnetka, the program following immediately after the buffet luncheon.

The program will be under the auspices of the department of "Government and Foreign Policy" of the League of which Mrs. Clifton Utley is state chairman, Mrs. Paul Douglas is county chairman, and Mrs. John Clark Baker is the local league chairman.

### Tells of Fascist Rule

Mrs. Douglas, wife of Prof. Douglas of the University of Chicago, but better known to leaguers as Emily Taft, daughter of Lorado Taft, who has just spent four months in both extremes of Italy during the height of the Abyssinian crisis, will talk on "Women and Children under the Fascist Regime" and also the general program of study of this department of the league.

Members of the league may make reservations as is customary with Mrs. W. T. Reece, but non-members who wish to attend that day may call the hostess for possible places, after members' reservations are in.

Mrs. Quincy Wright, who is well known on the north shore as a lecturer on international current events, and who is now in Geneva, Switzerland, observing the League of Nations at work, is the national chairman of this department of "Government and Foreign Policy."

### Seek Cooperation

The League of Women Voters through their department of "Government and Foreign Policy" seeks the prevention of war by international cooperation, it was explained.

It believes that much international friction could be prevented by dealing with controversial issues in international conferences and commissions. Furthermore, the League believes that, if disputes develop, they could be satisfactorily settled by such pacific methods as arbitration, conciliation, and judicial settlement, it was added.

In order to make the citizen's interest in international cooperation effective, the League of Women Voters considers as a primary function the creation of an informed public opinion upon international affairs, it was explained.

## James D. Wigglesworth Dies; Pneumonia Fatal

James Donovan Wigglesworth, 1066 Ash street, Winnetka, son of A. W. Wigglesworth of 125 Woodstock avenue, Kenilworth, and for many years a resident of Wilmette, died at the Evanston hospital Monday morning. He had been ill but a few days with pneumonia.

Mr. Wigglesworth was secretary of Hill-Clarke Machinery company with which he had been associated since 1922.

Popular among the younger set of Winnetka and Wilmette, his more recent activities included tennis and badminton. He attended Lake Forest academy, and Cornell university where he enlisted in the student army training corps, and after the armistice attended Purdue university.

He was a member of Alpha Delta Phi, a thirty-second degree mason, a shiner, and a member of the Winnetka Congregational church.

Surviving, besides his father, are his widow, Mrs. Gretchen Andree Wigglesworth, and three children, James, Richard and Nancy. Funeral services were held Wednesday at Memorial Park chapel, with burial in Memorial Park cemetery.

## Woman Dies Suddenly in Wilmette Residence

Miss Minnie Boe, 35, was found dead Monday afternoon in the home of T. H. Venn, 121 Maple avenue, where she had been employed for the past seven months as a maid. The body, lying on the floor of the bathroom, was discovered by Miss Modoff, a nurse. 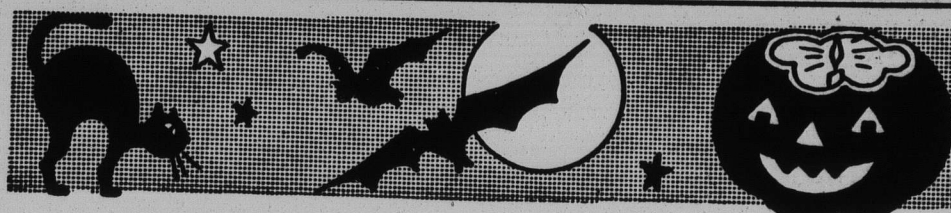

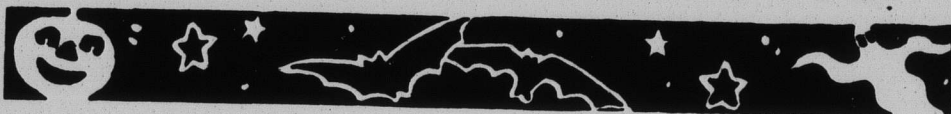
