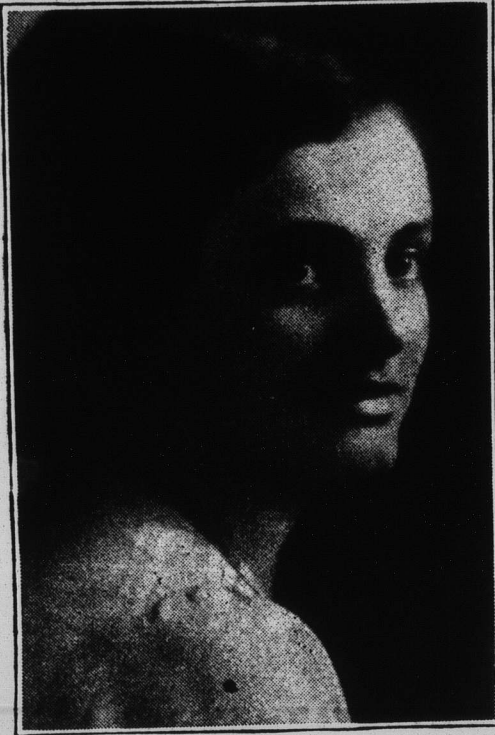

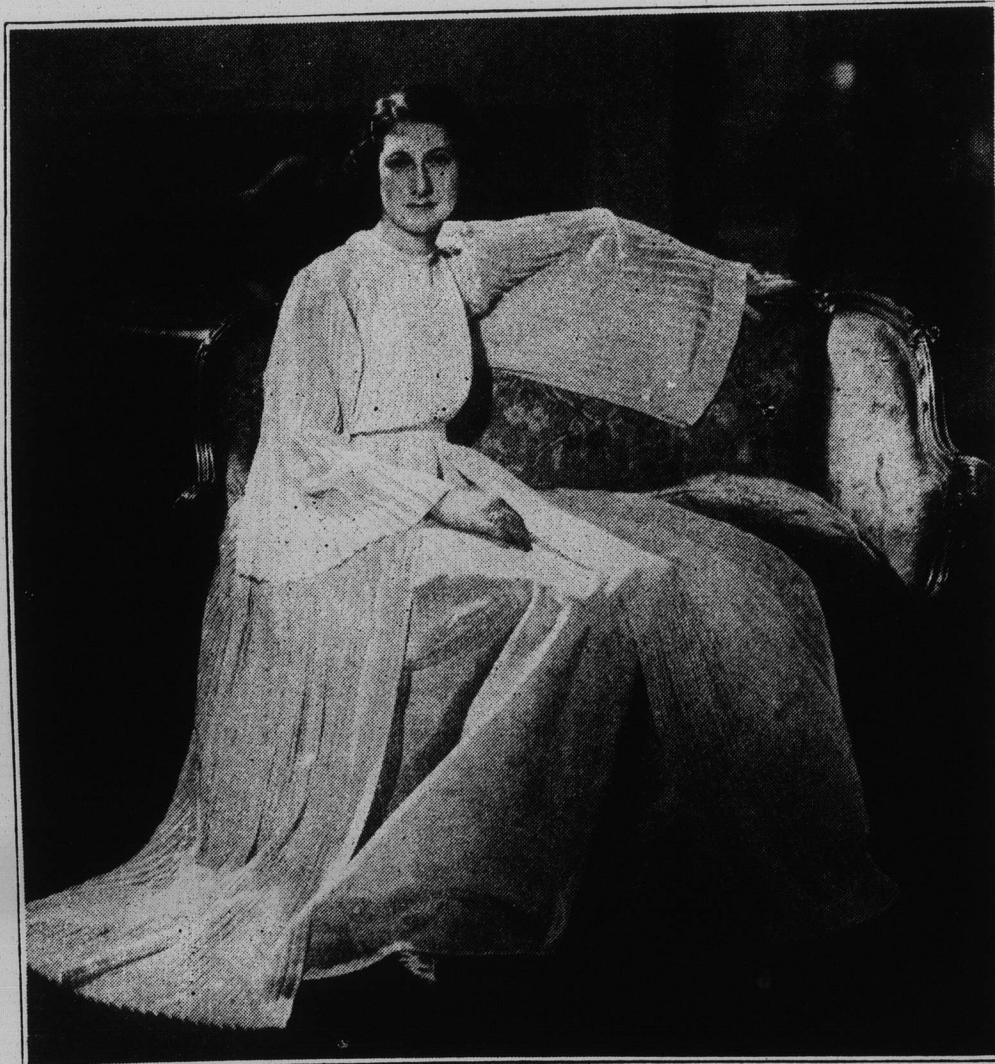
## Reviews Book
