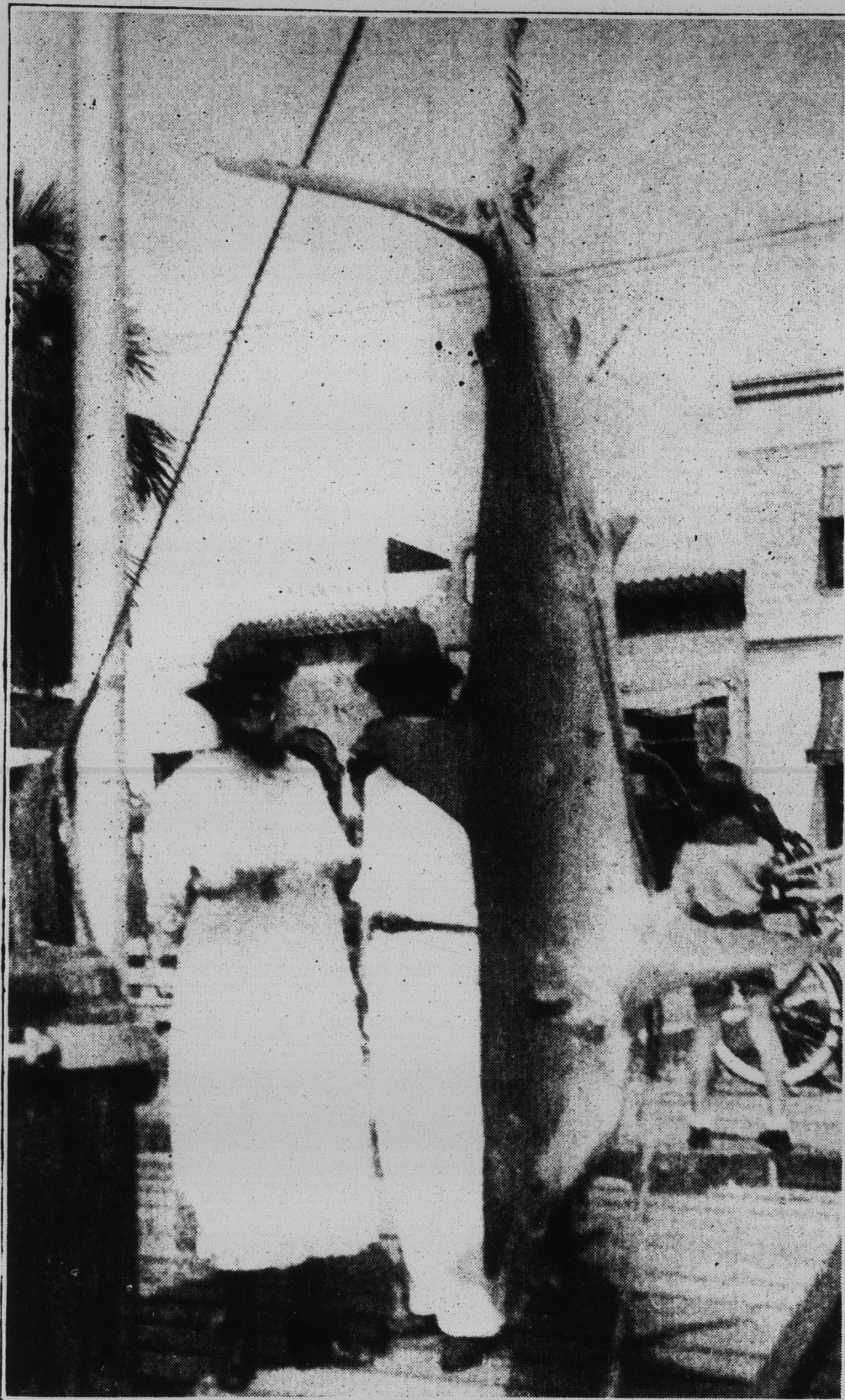


BUILDER TURNS FISHERMAN

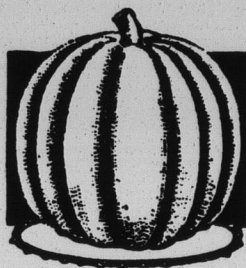
HEAR DR. WILLETT

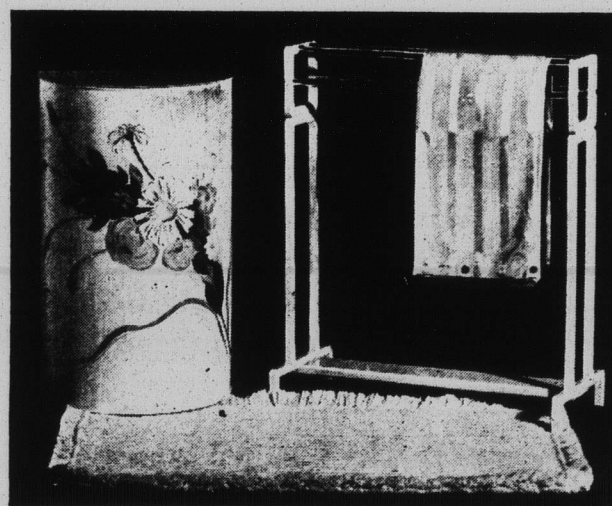
