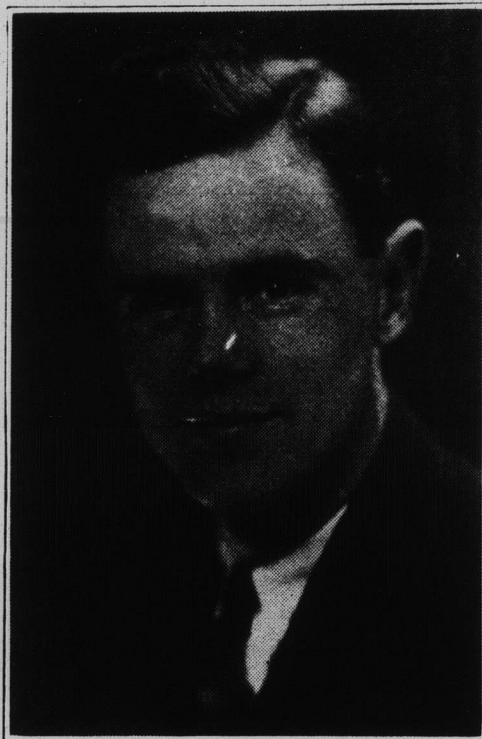
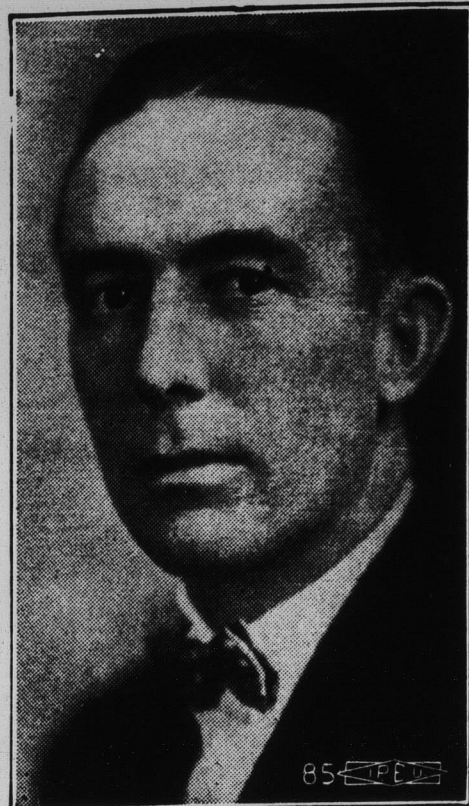

**ACTIVE IN RESCUE WORK**



These four north shore residents were among those busy, this week, in directing flood rescue work along the stricken Ohio river valley, representing the United States Coast Guard, the Illinois department of conservation, and the state naval militia.

Upper left, Lieutenant Carl Alfred Peterson, 144 Maple avenue, Wilmette, commander of the 26th division of the Illinois naval militia, is directing the work in Pulaski county, north of Cairo, along the Cache river, evacuating families, and maintaining communication and transportation in the area. He is being assisted by Lieutenant (Junior Grade) Chesley McAllister Evans, (lower left), 1314 Scott avenue, Hubbard Woods, commander of the 27th division of the Illinois naval militia.

Thomas J. Lynch, 1131 Green Bay road, Glencoe, (upper right), deputy chief game warden for Cook and Lake counties is in charge of a group of workers from the state department of conservation. With headquarters at Eldorado, he is directing rescue work

in Saline county and the lowlands around Harrisburg.

Chief Boatswain's Mate Carl E. Howell, commander of the Wilmette Harbor Coast Guard station, (lower right), was stationed this week in the Evansville, Ind., region, with the probability that his force would be ordered to continue down the Ohio and Mississippi rivers as the flood waters moved southward, if necessary.

Mrs. Inez C. Bliss, community nurse in charge of the Wilmette Health Center, and Miss Ruth Hanson, school nurse, were also working in the devastated areas along the Ohio river this week.
