March 15, 1917

Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Michaels had returned from an extended tour of Cuba. Collector Hoyt King had completed the township tax collection, with a gain of \$36,000 over the previous year.

Sylvester Sparling and S. W. Bennett were preparing their 90-foot yacht, lying in Wilmette harbor, for war patrol duty.

Village election was in the offing. Nominated were: For village president, Edward Zipf. For trustees, Mrs. Louis J. Pierson, Albert C. Bell and Joseph Heinzen. Treasurer, Henry W. Miller. Police magistrate, E. P. Dunshee. An opposition ticket was threatened.

Village Trustee Dr. William J. Montgomery was removing to Birmingham,
