West line, extended North, of Sterling  
Road with the extension easterly of

Roger Avenue which constitutes the  
northerly line of Lots twenty-five (25)  
to thirty-five (35) in James Rice

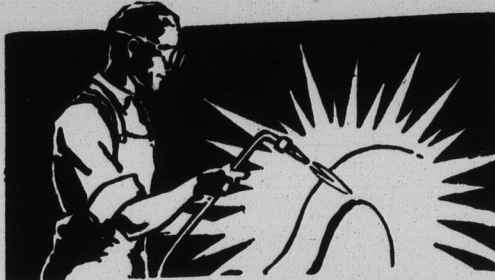
