Glencoe Playgrounds Team Takes Top Spot in Softball Rivalry

The Glencoe Playgrounds entry gained the supper hand in the scramble for first round honors in the North Shore Softball league by virtue of their 6 to 4 win over Evanston's Harrington Motors at South Park last Sunday. Glencoe's standing at the end of the first round is five won and one lost.

Evanston's Dampman-Schmitt Dodgers have yet to hurdle the Wienecke Hardware team from Glencoe before their standing will entitle them to share the top spot with Glencoe. The Dodgers will meet Wienecke's at Mason park, Evanston, probably on Friday evening, July 9. Dampman-Schmitt will rely on the pitching of Shimmin to take this game.

With a play-off seeming quite improbable, Dampman-Schmitt should have the edge over Bill Schroeder's Glencoe gang, because of their one point victory in a previous contest.

The second round of play in the North Shore league, which is sponsored by the Evanston Bureau of Recreation, will get under way Sunday, July 11. Games are scheduled for 10 a. m. At that time the CCC Camp will play the Harrington Motors at Harms woods, Glenview. The Wienecke Hardware entry will engage the Dampman-Schmitt Dodgers at South park, Glencoe. Horn's will play Matty Conrad's Winnetka Auto Sales team at Horn's, Niles Center, while the Shawnee Garage will entertain Glencoe Playgrounds at the village green, Wilmette.
