Myron Cottrell, 76, Passes Away at Home

Myron Bent Cottrell, 76 years old, retired banker, and a resident of Wilmette for the past 15 years, passed away suddenly at his home, 112 Sixth street, last Saturday.

Mr. Cottrell, former president of the Drexel State bank, Chicago, also formerly headed banks in Maywood and in Logan and Clarence, Iowa. He had been retired from active business for more than 10 years.
