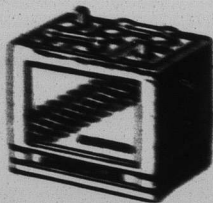

Volume on Arctic Birds Issued by Field Museum

A publication, "Food Habits of Some Arctic Birds and Mammals," was issued last week by Field Museum Press. It is a report on part of the research conducted by an expedition of the Chicago Zoological society to Newfoundland, Labrador, and Greenland under the leadership of the well-known explorer, Captain Robert A. Bartlett. The authors of the publication are Clarence Cottam, senior biologist, United States biological survey, and Harold C. Hanson, a volunteer and assistant in the division of birds at Field museum of Natural History. The study covers a phase of far northern ornithology on which current information is meager.
