Janet Marshall Wins Playwright Fellowship

Miss Janet Marshall, daughter of the John C. Marshalls of Hubbard Woods, was recently awarded one of the John Golden Playwright fellowships by the American Theater council. The committee selecting Miss Marshall and five other promising playwrights, who are the first to receive the awards since Mr. Golden donated the fund of \$5,000, more than a year ago, was composed of George S. Kaufman, Burns Mantle, Sidney Howard, Frank Crownshield, and Mr. Golden.

After completion of her undergraduate work at Bryn Mawr, Miss Marshall did her graduate work in the Yale School of Drama where she wrote and saw produced two plays: "A Streak of Pink," and "A Liberal Education." The former play won a \$2,500 prize two years ago in a national contest to encourage new playwriting talent.

Miss Marshall is already at work on a play to be completed under the fellowship.
