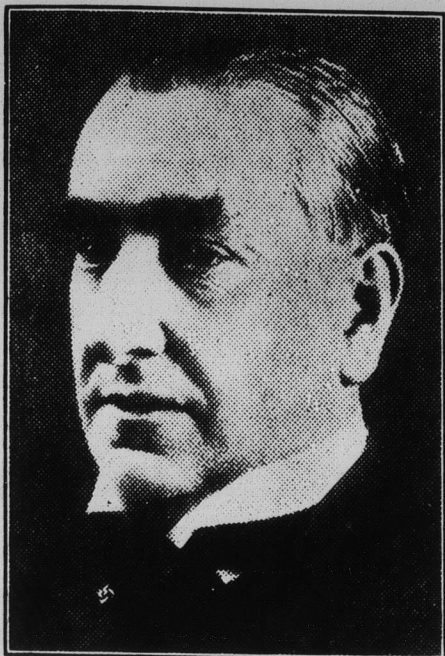


Sir Denison Ross to Lecture Friday at Orchestra Hall

Making his first public appearance in Chicago, Sir Denison Ross, English master of languages, will speak on "This Language of Ours," Friday, December 16, in Orchestra

hall, under the auspices of Northwestern university.

Sir Denison has served as head of the School of Oriental Studies in the University of London since its establishment in 1916. He recently retired from this position, and has come to America to deliver the Lowell lectures for 1938.

A graduate of the universities of Paris and Strasbourg, he has traveled widely in the Orient. He understands 48 languages, speaks twelve, and lectures in six. For thirteen years he served in the British foreign service with headquarters in Calcutta. He has been in Persia recently as the guest of the Iranian government, and in Turkey as the guest of the late Kemal Ataturk.

"My wide studies of Asiatic and European languages have given me a critical interest in my own mother tongue," Sir Denison said. "English is on the highroad to becoming the universal language of the civilized world for international intercourse, and we who enjoy the heritage of speaking it from our youth upwards have a certain responsibility in regard to its future."

Sir Denison's appearance marks the conclusion of the first half of the Northwestern university lectures this season. The program will be resumed after the holidays, with lectures by Christopher Morley on January 6 and Stefan Zweig on January 17.
