Will Show History by Pictures for D.A.R.

Margaret Selleck, artist and lecturer, of Des Plaines, Ill., will appear before Fort Dearborn chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution at its regular monthly meeting Monday afternoon, April 17, at the Woman's club of Evanston, in a program entitled "With Palette and Paint in Historic Wisconsin."

In a series of her own water color paintings the artist will depict the story of Wisconsin from the landing of Jean Nicolet at Red Banks in 1634 to the completion of the lake-surrounded capital at Madison. She has not attempted to reproduce the pictures of events but shows what now remains of the historic places so that the ground work for accurate knowledge of the past may be laid. She supplies notes and comments to accompany each picture. These were written by the artist in collaboration with Joseph Shaeffer of the University of Wisconsin and superintendent of the state historical society.

Mrs. Selleck is the wife of Eugene Selleck, superintendent of the Des Plaines schools.

Mrs. Selleck has studied at the Art Institute of Chicago and was a pupil of Rudolph Weisenborn at the Academy of Fine Arts. She studied portrait painting under the tutelage of Oskar Gross and worked in the art department of the University of Wisconsin. Her interest in her subject led her to foreign travel for the purpose of study. In 1934 Mrs. Selleck won a silver medal from the

All-Illinois Society of the Fine Arts, Chicago, and she was awarded first prize at the exhibit of the Illinois Federation of Woman's clubs in 1935.


