

Concert to Aid Education Center In West Evanston

A program of interest to music lovers of the North Shore will be the presentation of Franz Bodfors, well-known virtuoso-pianist, assisted by Hope Summers, dramatic reader and play interpreter.

Both artists are being presented by the Community Welfare association of Evanston, Thursday, May 11, at 8 p.m. This organization is making a \$1,000 drive for funds to establish an educational and recreational center of the West Side of Evanston. Tickets are on sale for this program in Great Hall, First Methodist church, at Church street and Hinman avenue. Reservations may be made at First Methodist church, Chandler's Book Store, North Shore hotel lobby, and The Magic Door Lamp Shop.

"Mr. Bodfors' recitals have won him numerous triumphs and have proved rarely thrilling experiences to the most musically discerning," reads an announcement. "His ability to seize the attention of the audience and to hold it in compelling concentration on the music under his hands has been much commented on, and even when his auditors have been counted in the thousands the same fixed intentness has been focused on his playing. By sheer virtuosity and great wealth of musical insight, his performances have aroused audiences to the highest state of enthusiasm. His listener's recognition of the master's touch in the pianist's penetrative approach to the music, illuminating its farthest reaches through sheer eloquence, has been instantaneous, and the receptions given Mr. Bodfors have been veritable ovations of overwhelming approval.

"His technical powers are so amazingly comprehensive and yet unobtrusive as to be given over wholly to the service of the music, to the expression of the musical idea and creative message of the composer. The combination of his 'prodigious technical fluency' and his 'consummate artistry' and sincerity of musicianship brings about a 'submerging of his personality to the glorification of his art'.

"Miss Summers, whose ability to catch the mood and portray the characters of her subjects because of her sympathetic insight into their lives and actions, will render a dramatic interpretation of Kaufman and Hart's 'The American Way'."

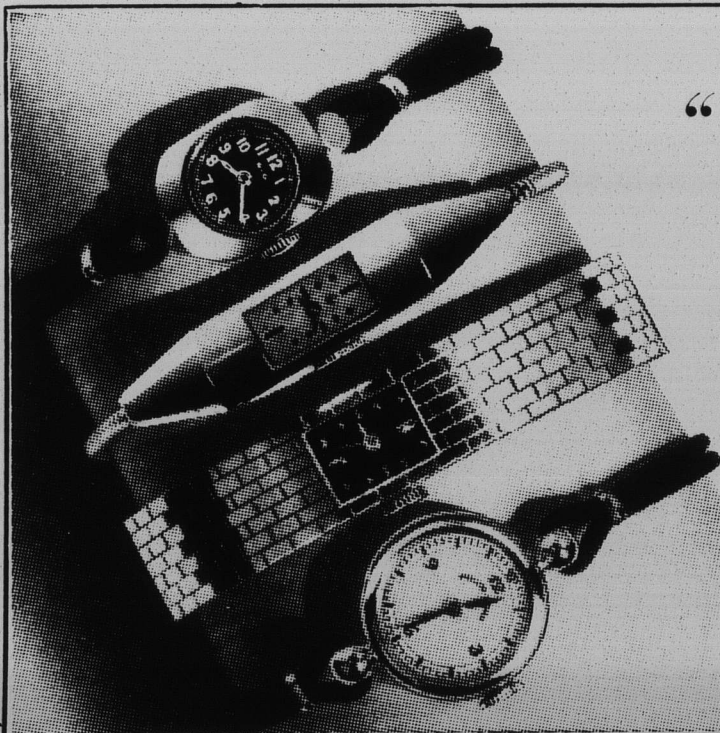
