

N. S. Girls in Vassar Theater Experiment

The Vassar Experimental theatre again pioneered in theatre production on December 8 and 9, by giving a modern interpretation of Gluck's opera "Orpheus," in which no word was spoken. The action of the music was performed in movements of pantomime and dance to musical recordings of the Gluck opera.

This is one of the first times that a dance pantomime performance of an opera to recorded music has been presented as a theatrical performance. It is an experiment which is being watched with interest not only because it brings together theatre education and music education, but because of the possibilities it suggests for the future of recorded music. It will indicate whether or not other colleges, and high schools, can, by this medium, increase their repertoires.

Students of Vassar from the North Shore who took part in this unique production include Elizabeth Burlingham of Winnetka, who was a member of the chorus, Patricia Austin of Glencoe, a member of the dance group, and Nancy Wolcott of Winnetka, in charge of the costume crew.
