

## Angna Enters Is Represented in Theater Art Show

Angna Enters, dance mime who will appear in concert in the New Trier High school auditorium Monday evening, October 22, is represented by a group of water colors in the current exhibit of stage settings and costumes comprising the International Exhibition of Theater Art at 26 S. Michigan avenue, Chicago.

The exhibit, which will be shown until September 26, has been assembled from many private collections, as well as theaters and museums of Europe and America, and contains over five hundred designs for costumes and stage settings, and many miniature model stages, each individually lighted. Miss Enters is exhibiting water colors from her theater, with designs for costumes and settings. At present she is in Greece, studying under the Guggenheim scholarship recently awarded her. Some of her sketches were shown in Chicago last fall, when she appeared at the Punch and Judy theater for a week.

The collection of theater design is the largest ever assembled. It was shown at the Museum of Modern Art in New York, and is now on a tour of the country. With practically no gaps, the exhibition gives a history of the development of theater art from the Renaissance to the present day, one-fourth being historical and the rest representative of the modern school of the United States, Russia, and thirteen European countries.

The works contributed by the Americans are considered the best of modern theater art. In addition to designs for plays already produced, each designer is represented by a project for a proposed production. There are designs by Robert Edmond Jones, Jo Melziner, Angna Enters, Virginia Dalton, Normal Bel Geddes, Cleon Throckmorton, and others. Thus north shore residents may see designs for a "composition" which Miss Enters is considering for her program at New Trier High school on October 22.

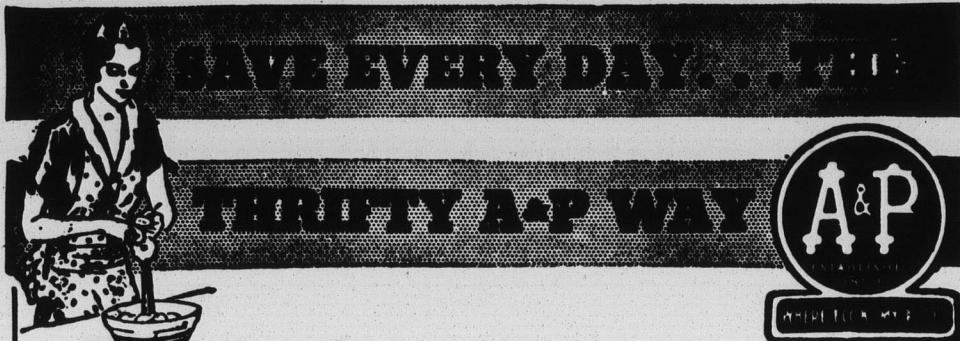
