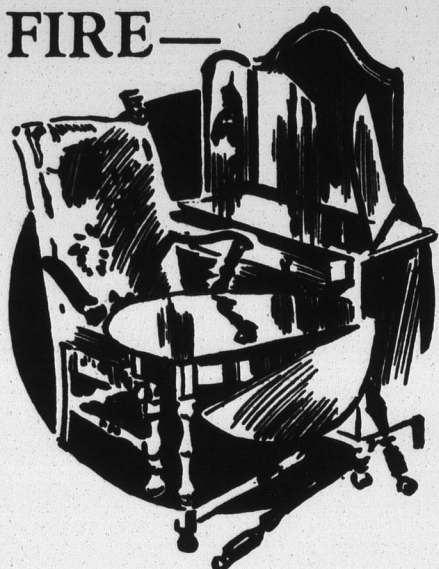


BRIDGE LUNCHEON

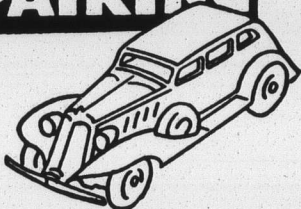
