The Kenilworth center was organized in 1932 by six young women. Today its membership quota is limited to sixty. The Kenilworth group helps to maintain the Seward Park station at Sedgewick and Elm streets, Chicago, a station which costs approximately \$10,000 per year to maintain, the Kenilworth group contributing \$4,000 of that amount.

The money is raised by numerous parties, dances, and the proceeds from the Jack and Jill shop located in the Hearthstone tea room in Hubbard Woods. All garments, attractive things for babies, are made by members of the organization.

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
