## BADGE PROJECTS

The badges and awards committee of the Wilmette Girl Scout council is sponsoring three badge courses at the present time.

A course in first aid and home nursing is being conducted by Mrs. Harry Burnside. There are 14 girls enrolled in this course, nine of whom have already successfully taken the

examination for the first aid badge. This badge requires a knowledge of treatment for fainting, sprained ankles, scratches, blisters, burns, poison ivy, bandaging, artificial respiration, and control of bleeding. The home nurse badge, which will be the subject of the remainder of the course deals with proper care of a sick room at home, and care of the invalid other than that demanding professional services.

## MOUNTED GROUP

Wilmette and Kenilworth Scouts are earning their horsemanship badge at Crestwood stables on Saturday afternoons from 2 to 3. Miss Peggy Magic, a Wilmette Scout is helping the grooms instruct these girls. For the horsemanship badge a girl must know how to saddle and bridle a horse, mount and dismount properly, know the correct way to handle all the trappings, know the things to be considered in planning a stall, as well as the proper etiquette for riding. Also, to acquire the badge, a girl must know how to take care of her horse, and to abide by the knowledge.

The project will include taking pictures, developing negatives and printing the pictures, as well as learning the parts of the camera and how to use it to best advantage.
