Ulrich A. Middledorf, assistant professor of art at the University of Chicago, will speak on "Artists and Artisans in the Italian Renaissance" when he gives the next in the series of art lectures in the North Shore Art league studio of Winnetka Community House Friday evening, January 14. The series is sponsored by the league.

The lecture will mark the opening of a collection of etchings, a Black and White Loan exhibition shown through the courtesy of the Chicago Society of Etchers.

Professor Middledorf was educated at the University of Berlin, and was for many years curator in the Institute of Art Research at Florence, Italy.
