**NEW TRIER HIGH SCHOOL NEWS****"Exchange" Teacher
Speaker at Meeting**

The Commerce club of New Trier High school was to meet this Thursday, to hear a talk by Miss Daisy Wright, exchange teacher from England, on the subject, "A Comparison of English Habits and Customs with American." Miss Wright was to give many illustrations to show how differently students act from their English comrades in when and what they eat, how they pronounce words and how they get recreation and amusement.

"Some of the English customs might profitably be copied by us, particularly the regulations for safety in driving automobiles," was the comment of David Johnson, the club's faculty sponsor, "Drivers in England must obtain licenses. A beginner, who must be at least 17, gets only a provisional license good for three months or until he can pass a rigid driver's test.

"During his probation period his car must carry on both front and rear a white card about a foot square marked in red with a large letter 'L' which stands for 'Learner.' We might even improve on this custom by requiring cards marked 'S' to be carried for a few months by drivers arrested for speeding and some marked 'D' for those caught driving while drunk. Our famous and excellent judge in the Chicago traffic court could think of some other variations and perhaps would favor the adoption of this idea," he added.

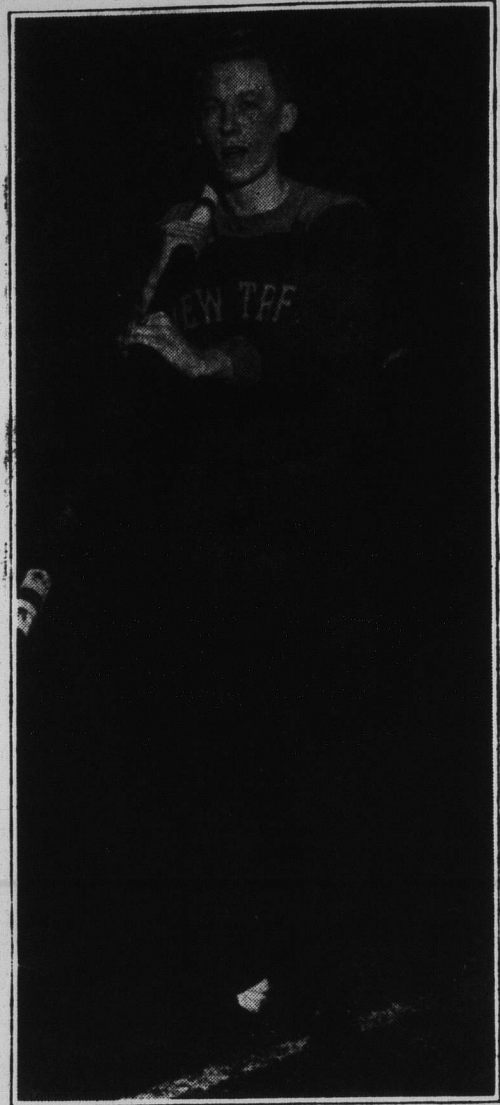
**Illinois Symphony Will
