# MUSIC STUDENTS TO GIVE RECITAL

April 7 Set as Date of Concert at Howard School Auditorium by Instrumental Groups

The music department of the Wilmette public schools will present its annual spring concert comprising its instrumental groups at the Howard school auditorium Thursday evening, April 7, at 8 o'clock.

Instead of combining instrumental and choral groups into one program, this year the concert will feature the orchestra and band due, it was explained, to the increased interest of the students in instrumental playing.

The student orchestra is under the direction of Mrs. Margaret Russell and during the past season has given several programs along the North Shore. In addition to her work with the orchestra Mrs. Russell is also teacher of the violin in the Wilmette Public Schools.

### Special Students

An especial feature of this concert will be the debut of the new school band numbering 42 pieces under the direction of Arian Delander. "It has been several years since the Wilmette schools

have had a band and the interest and enthusiasm of its members promises a real treat to those who attend this concert," it was said. Mr. Delander is teacher of woodwinds.

# Horsemen Go West and Indian Hill's Golfers Are Happy

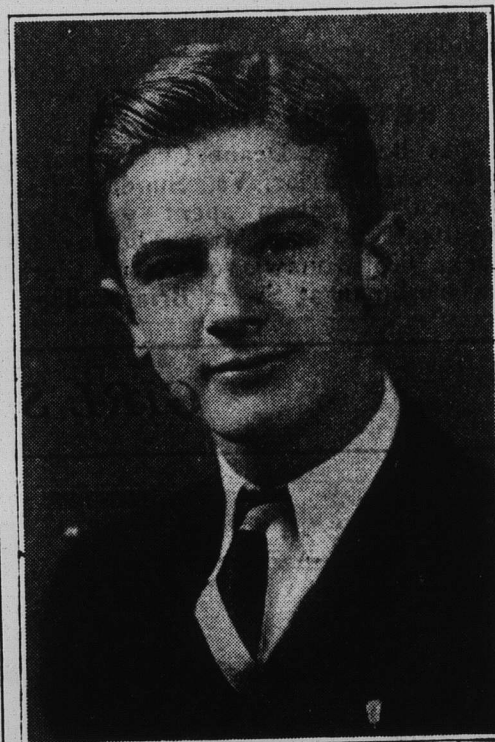
The Indian Hill Riding club, organized fifteen years ago, is closing the stable door today for the last time. The buildings are being converted into garages for the Indian Hill Golf club machinery or are being taken down, and the favorite riding horse or pony is a thing of the past.

Many remember the time when, as a prank, some youngsters opened the stall doors one stormy night before an important golfing event, and by daybreak on the best greens were found hoof-prints three inches deep. John Courté, the veteran greens keeper, on that day swore vengeance on horse and horseman. Now John surveys with satisfaction the long rows of empty stalls.

Within a few months after the incorporation of the Riding club in 1923, the Indian Hill Hunt was started. In 1927, however, the directors of the Riding club, having lost interest in the rough sports of following hounds, voted to disband the hunt.

Scores of children, some now grown up, from Winnetka and nearby villages, look back with much pleasure upon happy days on horseback in the Skokie valley under the auspices of the Indian Hill Riding club. But golfers again breathe easily—the greens are safe—the last Indian Hill horseman has gone West.

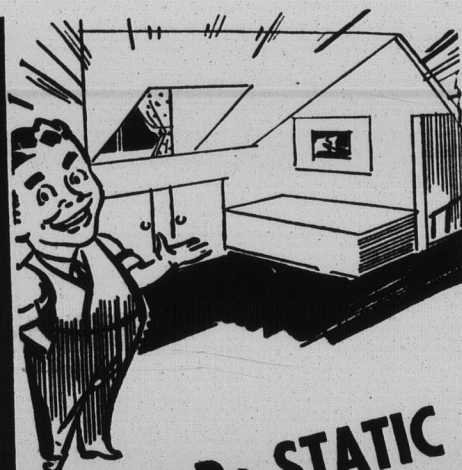
