Leo H. Lowitz of Chicago, president of the Chicago division of the American Jewish Congress, and Max Kopstein of Chicago and Mrs. M. J. Krensky of Glencoe, conference chairmen, have assembled an imposing group of speakers for the Congress' fourth annual conference to be held Sunday, April 3, in the Grand ballroom of the Sherman hotel.

Carl Sherman, prominent New York attorney, long active in communal undertakings, Jewish and non-Jewish, will address the Congress on "World Jewry's Struggle to Maintain Its Fundamental Rights." Col. Frank Knox, publisher of the Chicago Daily News, also will address the morning session, speaking on "Dictators on a Rampage." At the afternoon session, George H. Earle, governor of the state of Pennsylvania, will speak on "The Menace of Fascism."
