N. T. Pupils High in State Latin Tourney

Of the 65 contestants from the nine schools which met last Saturday at Evanston High school in the district meet of the Illinois Latin tournament, three students of New Trier High school won places for the sectional meet which will be held at De Kalb later in the month.

Winners in this latter meet will be sent to the state meet at the University of Illinois for a final state contest.

From New Trier, in the freshman group: second place—with a difference of only one point from that of the winner of first place—was won by Mason Gaffney; in the sophomore group: second place, Jack Walker; junior group: second place, Bernice Stein. These students, together with winners from Evanston and La Grange, will represent the Lake Shore division in the next contest.

The sectional meet which was scheduled for April 16 will probably be postponed to April 23 to avoid a conflict with the date of schedule for the University of Chicago examinations, it was announced.

New Trier Victors in Oak Park's Classic

Although they took only one first place, New Trier last Saturday dethroned Oak Park as the champion of the western school's own relays, and annexed the title by the narrow margin of 43½ points to 43 for the defenders in the Oak Park field house.

New Trier also placed in every event except in the mile where they were not represented at all.

Jim McFadzean, winner of the broadjump, was New Trier's sole first place man.
