

Old Eye Glasses and Frames Sought for Philanthropy

The Chicago Woman's aid, in pursuing its extensive work in sight-saving, and aid for the blind, has established depots on the north shore where glasses and frames may be left for collection by the society for use among those in need. Mrs. M. R. Rosen, 1045 Elmwood avenue, Wilmette, is in charge of collecting contributions from the north shore depots which are the following drug stores:

Wilmette—Lyman-Rennekar pharmacy, and Lyman Pharmacy.

Winnetka—Fred S. White's Drug store, and Walgreen Drug store.

Glencoe—Adams Drug company.

Many persons, the Woman's aid knows, have old frames for glasses and old glasses whose lenses are no longer the right prescription. Where, in cases of children, especially, or

those whose vision needs correction, doctors find that old lenses are suitable, or can be reground to be of use, that is done, and the glasses given where they are needed. If lenses cannot be used, the gold and silver cases are sold and with money so derived, new glasses are purchased.

The need is great, and so, to the north shore the Chicago Woman's aid makes its appeal for contributions which may be left at any of the previously mentioned drug stores. The problem of just what to do with old glasses is thereby solved.

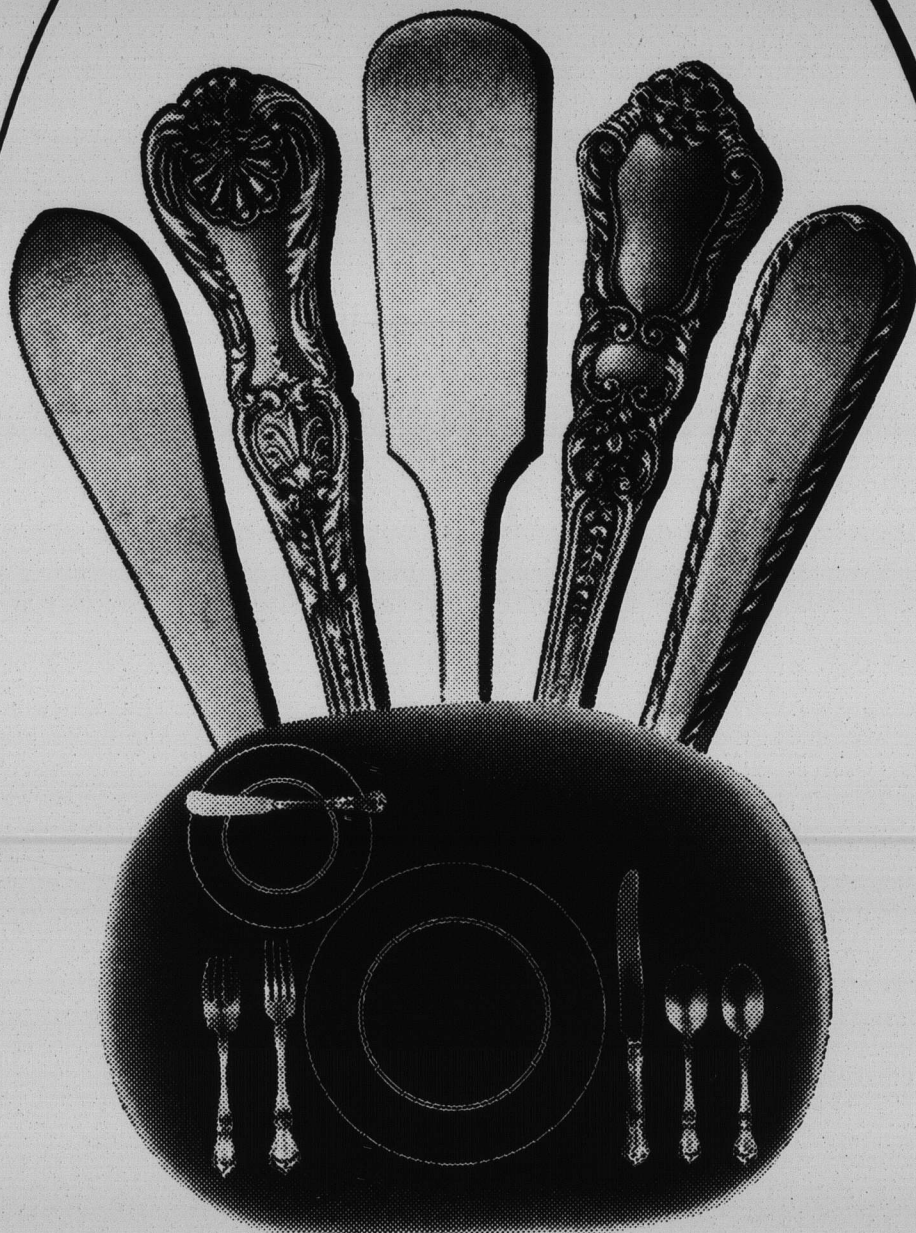
