TUGS ED IN ICE

CHARLEVOIX—Two commercial fishing tugs trapped in big ice floes west of Charlevoix, were towed to safety yesterday by the coast guard cutter Woodbine.

The tugs, Jackie C. and G. L. Dornbos, owned by John Cross of Charlevoix, were trapped during the week-end on their return from a fishing expedition.

The Woodbine had been on duty at the Straits of Mackinac with the ice breaker Mackinaw and was detailed to aid the two tugs.

TRIO BELIEVED LOST

PENTWATER Mich. — Hope dwindled today for the survival of three fishermen who disappeared on a 40-foot tug that was believed to have exploded and burned. The ship's stern was washed ashore yesterday. Previously, burned lumber and a pilot's cabin and a life jacket were found off shore and identified as having come from the tug, "The Pal." Aboard the ship Saturday when it disappeared in a fog were Daniel Loncar, 36, the owner, Merrill Ginther, 49, both of Pentwater and Clyde Smith, 45, of Mears. Coast guard planes continued to patrol Lake Michigan today.
