Kurtz, Zyble, Hubert Lead Jacks' Scoring

With its annual opening game loss to Traverse City out of the way Alpena Community College turned its attention Nov. 21, to its first conference game.

The Collegians made a vain attempt Saturday night to stage one of the greatest comebacks in basketball history, but fell short. Traverse City's Northwestern Michigan College claimed a 76-63 triumph. Both teams are members of the Michigan Junior College Conference, but this initial game does not figure in the standings.

However, this week Friday, Alpena is host to Port Huron Junior College and this one is for keeps.

Played in Grayling

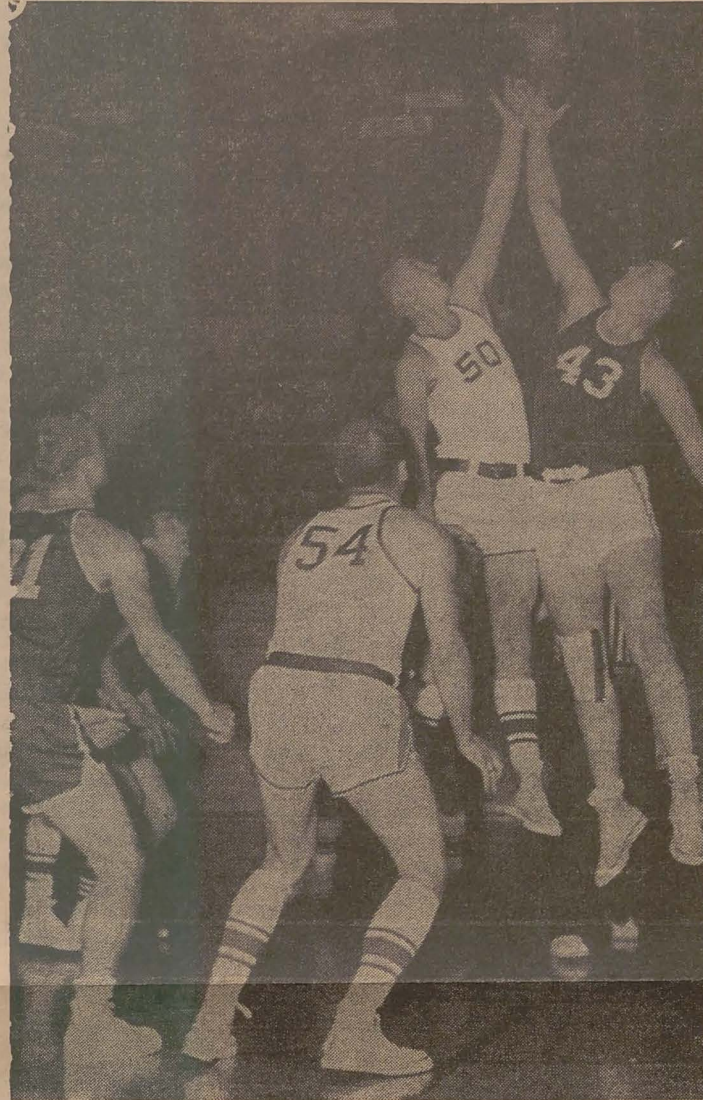
Saturday's game was played in the Grayling High school gym before a crowd of about 300. It was believed to be the first college game in Michigan this season. The event was sponsored by the Grayling High Athletic Association and following the game, players from both teams were fed through the courtesy of the Kiwanis Club.

It marked the fourth straight year that Alpena had lost its opening game to Traverse City. But, it looked for a while as though the Lumberjacks would come back from a 35-24 halftime deficit.

With a little less than 12 minutes left in the game, Alpena trailed by 17 points, 53-36. Six quick baskets were made by Jim Zyble, a 6-1 freshman from Cheboygan; Bob Kurtz, one of two sophomores on the team and a former Alpena High player; and Fred Hubert, five-nine guard who prepped at Alpena Catholic Central. Each counted two.

Margin Down to Six

Kurtz' second bucket came with 7½ minutes left and put Alpena just seven points behind, 57-50. Traverse City called for a time out! After both teams scored a basket and Zyble tossed in a free throw, Alpena had cut the margin to six points 59-53. See LUMBERJACKS Page 4
