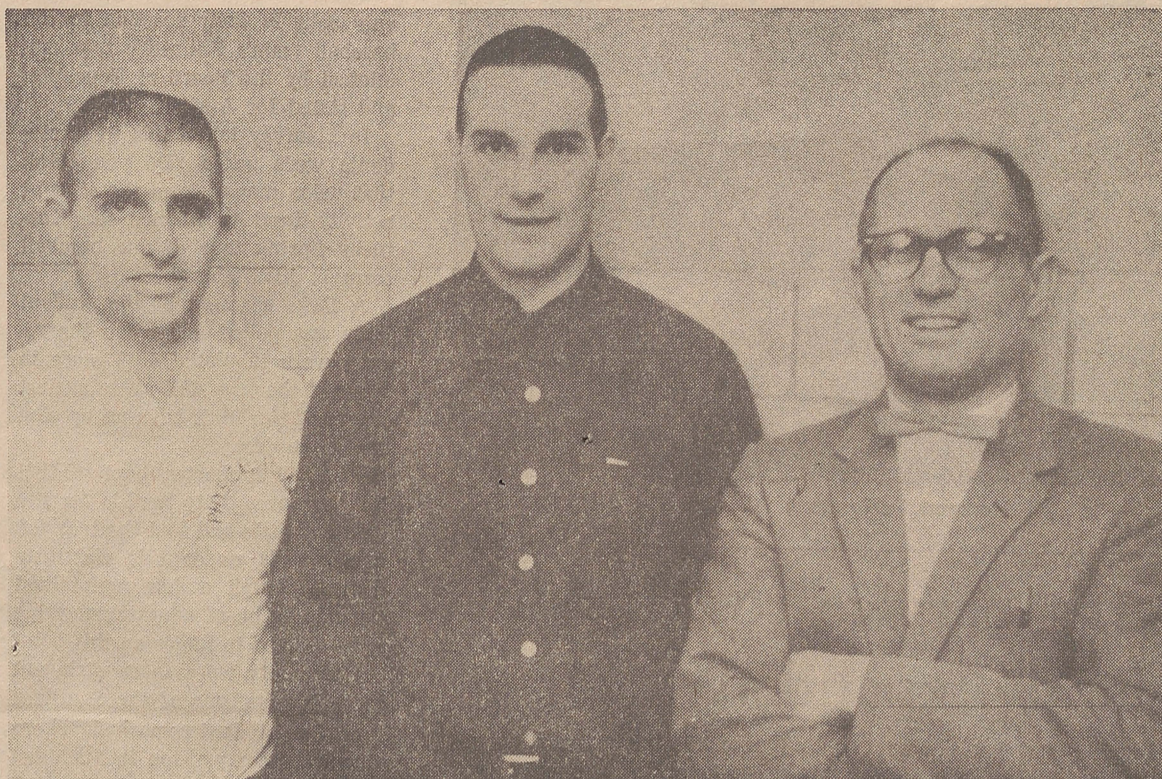
Now that basketball season is finished until next year, the attention of the sports-minded people turns to spring sports.
