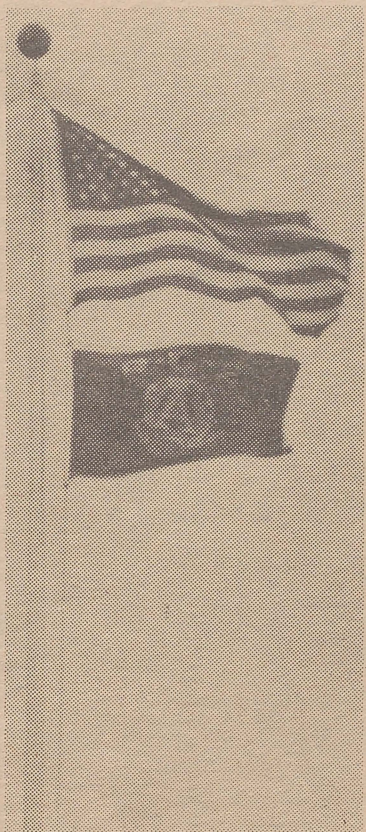
With the successful I.M. football season over, the active participants look forward to I. M. basketball and bowling. This is presently underway.

The times for this year's event were the best ever with the first twenty-five running the best times they ever did.

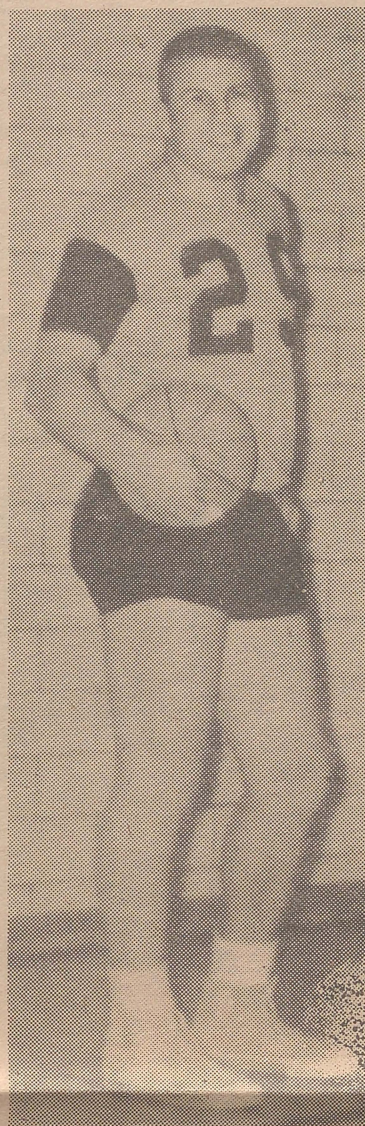
Marlatt was the first Jack finisher in 20th place. Last year Rod placed tenth; however, his time was better this year than last.
