

## War On Poverty Funds Allocated

The war on poverty is being carried out to aid stricken people. Money is being appropriated and doled out to different forces which are fighting poverty. Under the new Authorization Bill many beneficial agencies have had their economy bolstered. Head Start is assured of \$352 million; Neighborhood Youth Corps was authorized \$410 million, with a limit on operating costs per enrollee not to exceed \$7,500 a year. Also authorized were \$31 million for VISTA and \$100 million for the work experience program. Restrictions imposed by the Anti-poverty Bill consists of (1) that CAA's not pay salaries of more

than \$15,000 with Federal funds, (2) CAA's, as of March 1, must allot one-third of their governing seats to representatives of the poor chosen by residents of the poor area, (3) no assistance will be available to individuals who have been convicted of inciting, promoting or carrying on a riot or group activity resulting in material damage to property or injury to persons. It is hoped that these restrictions will discourage slighted areas from re-enacting scenes such as took place in Watts and Chicago. If the areas ignore the restrictions, they will find themselves without government assistance.

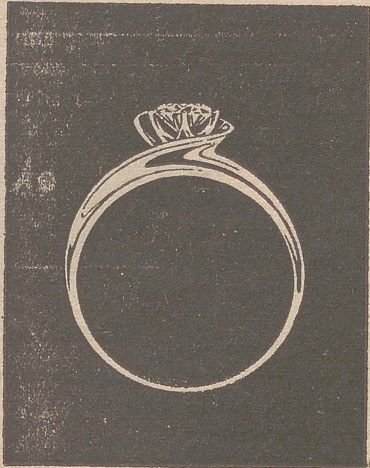
## Multi-Instructor Finds Home Here
