"Moving to this campus in '58," commented Dean Stanley Van Lare when asked what he felt was the greatest accomplishment

he had witnessed in the growth of ACC, "People don't realize that this college lived for six years,

using the left-over facil-ities of the high school." Born in Marion, New York, Dean Van Lare secured his BA degree at Hope College in Holland, Michigan and continued on with graduate work at Syracuse, New York. Upon his full retirement in 1968, the Dean will have completed a total of 35 years of service in the Alpena Public School System.

Before becoming dean at ACC, he was Director of the Veterans Institute, Director of Guidance and Counseling and head of Adult Education in the Al-

pena Public School System. A second major achievement, he felt, was the Alpena Community College
