

CONCRETE TECH TO BE OFFERED ON A FULL-SCALE BASIS

Alpena Community College has announced the start of this nation's first two-year, full scale concrete technology course leading to a degree of Associate in Applied Science

A small group of students already are enrolled for pilot classes and the complete course program is expected to be underway in the fall of 1968. By that time, 20 to 40 students will be enrolled.

The course is under the direction of P. J. Mielock, P. E., formerly a faculty member at Michigan State University and field engineer for the Portland Cement Association.

"The well-rounded program will fulfill a long-felt construction industry need to provide more adequately trained technicians in all phases of concrete use," Mielock said. "The two-year course should produce graduates who will be fully competent to assume responsible positions in the construction industry wherever technical knowledge of concrete is required."

The Alpena Community College concrete technology program has been approved by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and by the Veterans Administration for those eligible under the G.I. Bill.

The course will cover all phases of concrete mix design, transportation, placement, and finishing, and will include additional instruction on aggregates, various types of cements, applied physics, general drafting, handling of materials, and technical mathematics.

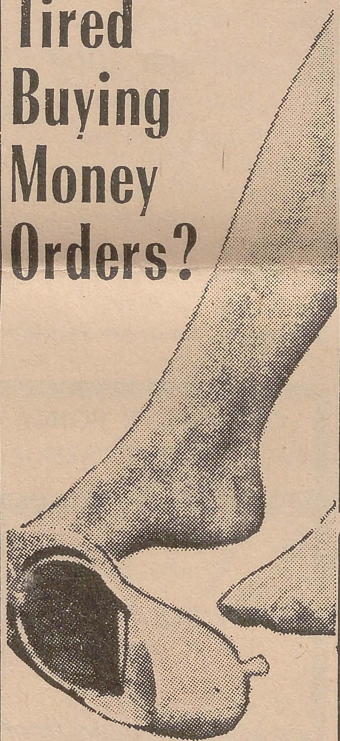

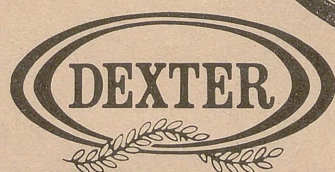
