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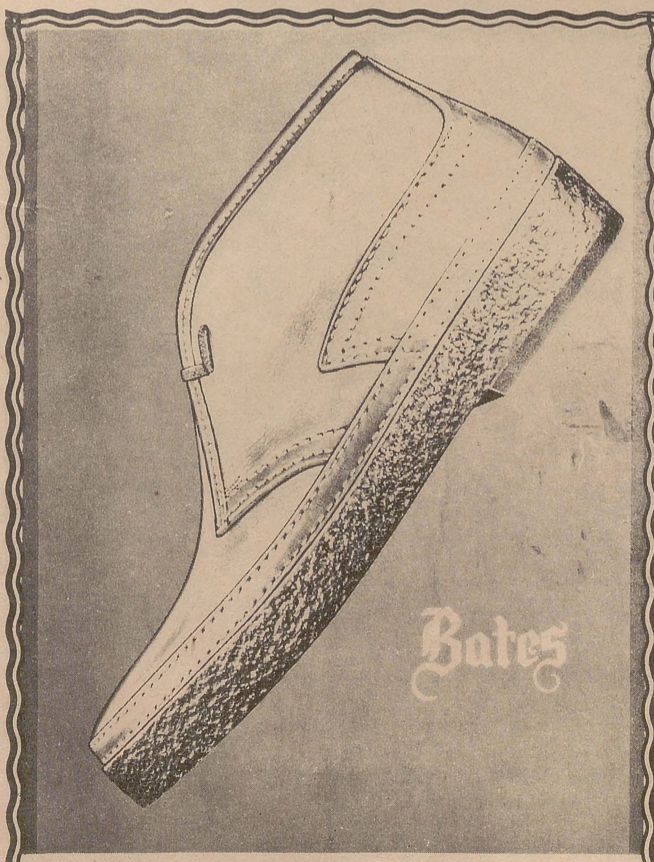

Through the efforts of the Doran Electric Company, the Alpena Power Company, and the school personnel, the power was completely restored at approximately 3:30 Monday, February 12.

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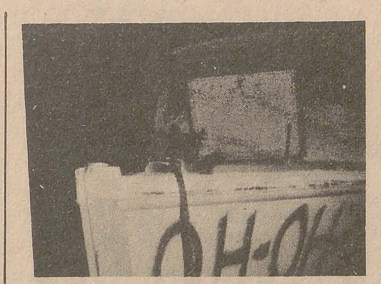
ARSENIC SLAYS THEATRE AUDIENCE

If you are an ardent follower of the Alpena Civic Theatre you may have been dissappointed when you tried to get into the last performance. Arsenic and Old Lace, a three act comedy by Joseph Kesselring, sold out for all four performances days in advance.

Under the usual brilliant directing of Keith Titus, and acting of the ACT players, Arsenic proceeded to break up the audience all four nights.

The play opens with two sweet, elderly aunties, who have poisoned twelve lonely gentlemen to put them out of their misery. Sylvia Owen (Aunt Abby) and Dorothy Heiberg (Aunt Martha) portray sweet, religious-minded, good hearted spinsters to perfection. The plot thickens when two brothers, childhood enemies, both come to live at home. Johnathan (Emmet Heiberg) and Dr. Eienstien (John Thompson) return with a slightly dead Mr. Spenzalzo along, Mortimer (Steve Fitzpatrick) and the other brother, discovers him and decides to put the heat on. MULTIPLE PURPOSE BOAT FOR COLLEGE

Through the combined efforts of Dean Petosky and Mr. Alan Reed, director of vocational and technical education at the Besser Technical School, Alpena Community College is now the proud owner of a U.S. Coast Guard surplus boat. The vessel, which was purchased for one hundred dollars, will be used for various purposes.

One of the programs in which the vessel will be used frequently is the hatchery. It will also be very useful in the Aquatic Science Program.

The launching date for the boat is April first, but before it can be launched it must have a name. Therefore, in the near future there will be a contest held to find an appropriate name for the boat. The winner of the contest will be awarded a prize.

Flight Training Program at ACC Approved by V.A.

The Veterans Administration has approved Alpena Community College's new flight-training program, thereby making assistance available to veterans who have a vocational objective in aviation and who have a private flying license or who have satisfactorily completed the required flying and ground school instruction for a private license.

This program is the first of its type to be offered in the Midwest and consists of a two-year course in aviation leading to an Associate in Applied Science degree in aeronautics. It is designed to fulfill three basic aviation needs: to qualify the student for employment with the air lines, employment in general aviation, or flight training to be incidental to another profession or occupation.

Although being of interest to Veterans, this course is open to all applicants who are able to qualify. Prospective students are invited to contact Mr. Alan Reed, director of technical education at A.C.C. for further information.
