## College Catalog 'Dropouts'


Upon comparing the 70-71 college catalog to the Spring, 71 class schedule it appears that several classes have been dropped.

For ACC students this is merely an accepted part of college life. Students here for a year or so are becoming aware of this happening quite often. Even in the summer 1970 program, several classes were dropped.

This may not have much effect on students presently enrolled in the college, but it can cause problems for students who will be entering the school for 2nd semester. Take for example students who attended ACC last year and then dropped out, or servicemen who attended ACC for a semester before entering the military. They can return now to finish the 2nd semester of a class they took, and it is no longer offered.

What of the students who are transferring to ACC after attending other colleges? They may be coming here to take specific classes which are listed in the catalog. It must be a great feeling for them to come up to Alpena only to find the classes are not given, even though the catalog says they are.

Classes listed as being offered in the catalog, but not in the Spring schedule are: Intermediate Accounting 224, Merchandizing Cost Accounting 228, Creative Writing 229, News Reporting 253, News Writing 254, Basic Drawing II 128, Painting II 224, Weaving 242, Metals II 228, Piano 222, Voice 224, First Aid and Safety 209, Introduction to Engineering 122, Dynamics 222, Math Fortran Programming 220, Introduction to Astronomy 123, Entomology 226, Audio Visual Teaching Materials 122, History of England 226, Medical Dictation and Transcription 226, Advanced Shorthand 244, Materials 226, and Airframe and Powerplant Mechanics 102.



## ELEPHANT TRAINING 121
